CDS HORSE OF THE YEAR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Entries close & must be received by - **Friday, September 2, 2011**
Last Day to Qualify - **Friday, September 2, 2011**

US Equestrian Federation rules will be followed.

At no time during the CDS ANNUAL SHOW may any horse entered in that Championship be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the championship competition on the horse - one horse/one rider (exception: grooms riding on loose rein - please see page 12 rule 3 for additional information). This is in effect from the time the horse arrives at the showgrounds.

Tests may not be called. Whips may not be carried.
Riders must be prepared to ride in any class scheduled on any day.
Top 12 riders only may advance to second test if schedule warrants.

Horse/rider combinations that have competed in the Horse of the Year competition at Training through First Level who have placed Champion or Reserve will no longer be eligible for CDS awards at that level. Freestyles are exempt from this restriction.

HOY classes are offered in two divisions for Training Level through Intermediaire I and Grand Prix, Open and Adult Amateur. No cross-entries between divisions will be allowed. Adult Amateurs are defined as riders who are 22 years and over and hold a USEF Amateur Card. Juniors and Young Riders are eligible to compete in Open division only.

Scores from the CDS Junior Championships and RAAC DO count toward qualifying for the CDS Championships, as long as they are held within the qualifying period.

A horse/rider combination must achieve the following scores for CDS qualifying: When two (2) or more judges score a single ride, the combination of judges counts as ONE judge and the average of their scores counts as ONE score. Horses must be at least 4 years old. Scores can be earned at any test of the level

2011 CDS FUTURITY CLASSES

All horses entered must have been born in 2005, 2006 or 2007. Horses who compete as 4 Year Olds may nominate again the following year as 5 Year Olds and again as 6 Year Olds. Horses may have shown at any level prior to the Futurity.

A nomination fee of \$100 must be paid prior to July 1, 2011. If paid after July 1, the fee will be \$150. Nomination fees are held in a special account and put into the purse the year the horse is nominated for the Futurity. There are no restrictions, other than age and no qualifying for the California Dressage Society Young Horse Futurity.

Futurity Perpetual Trophy to be awarded to 5 yr. old winner. Ribbons through tenth.

Futurity tests may not be read. NO whips are permitted. Futurity Warm-up classes are open to Futurity horses only. Only one Warm-up class per entry.

USDF Junior Dressage Seat MEDAL SEMIFINALS

Qualification Requirements

The USDF Dressage Seat (DSM) Medal Semi-Finals classes will be offered at all nine Great American/USDF Regional Championships. In 2011 all junior riders through age 18 who have qualified at any level for the Regional Championships (excluding freestyle) are automatically eligible to compete in these Semifinal Classes. **Last day to qualify is September 2, 2011.**

- Riders must be current members of USEF and Participating members of USDF at time of qualifying and meet current USEF definition of Junior (DR119)
- Although riders must have qualified for the Championships on a horse that is USDF Lifetime Registered and USEF Recorded, ANY horse or pony that is eligible to compete in a USEF recognized competition may be ridden in DSM Semifinals or finals Classes. There is no qualification, ownership, or registration requirement (USDF HID numbers are required). Borrowed horses may be ridden. Stallions are not permitted

Class Specifications

Two Semifinals Classes will be offered, one for riders 13 and under, and one for riders 14 through 18. The top two riders from each age division in each of the 2011 Semi-finals will be invited to the 2012 Finals in their respective age groups.

In all classes the rider's position, seat, and use and effect of the aids will be judged as outlined in DR117. Competitors must wear hard hats in all semifinal and final classes. Competitors shall perform movements simultaneously, however, judges may ask for independent execution of certain movements. All instructions will be publicly announced. Riders must be judged at the medium walk, working trot (sitting and rising), and working canter both directions. They may also be asked to execute a free walk, transitions from one gait to the next in both directions, transition from the walk to halt and vice versa. In small groups or independently they may be asked to perform without stirrups, leg yield, changes of lead through trot, serpentine at the trot, show a shallow loop serpentine with counter canter, as well as trot or canter lengthening.

AMATEUR & JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER SPECIFICATIONS

Amateurs and Junior/Young Riders: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Federation Rule Book. *All riders entering the Ad/Am classes must possess or have applied for a US Equestrian Federation Amateur Card prior to riding in the class. All riders in Amateur Divisions must present an US Equestrian Federation Amateur Card when picking up their number or they will not be allowed to show in the Amateur Division.* Cards may be applied for at the show office. Jr/Yr classes (Junior/Young Rider) are open to riders under 21 years of age as of December 1, 2010. **You must specify on the entry which section you are entered in, ie. Open, Amateur or Junior/Young Riders. Jr/Yr must include birthdate on entry.**

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. ALL CLASSES AT THE 2011 USDF/Great American Insurance Group Region 7 Championships and CDS Annual Championship Show are covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

2. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

3. All entries must be made on official entry blanks and filled out completely as to classes entered, signatures, association numbers and qualifying scores. Parents or guardians must sign the official entry blank of a minor child before numbers will be released. **Entry form must be signed by groom or anyone who will sit on the horse. Full payment must accompany all entries.** Late entries will be accepted as schedule permits with a \$100.00 late fee.

4. \$25.00 will be charged if any of the following are missing or incorrect: 1) Missing signatures: Each entry must have a separate signature for rider, trainer, groom, coach, or adult responsible for horse, owner, and if applicable, parent or guardian; 2) Missing US Equestrian number for rider, owner, or trainer. Missing CDS number for Owner or Rider 3) Missing street address or zip code; 4) Missing phone number for rider; 5) Entering incorrect classes, ie. Open instead of Amateur or Junior. Double check the class numbers; 6) Forgetting to request stabling or tack rooms or with whom you wish to be stabled ; 7) Not filling out the back of the entry pertaining to qualifying scores and emergency numbers,

5. SCRATCHES: All fees, less a \$35 Office Fee, will be returned if horses are scratched before the Closing Date. **THERE ARE NO REFUNDS OF CLASS FEES OR STALL/TACK ROOM FEES FOR ANY REASON AFTER THE CLOSING DATE!!** If not qualified, all fees less a \$35 office fee will be returned.

6. Schedule: Riders must be prepared for any Championship or Horse of the Year Class to be scheduled on any day from Thursday through Sunday, If you wish to restrict the maximum number of rides per day, you must indicate so on your entry and which classes you would prefer to drop.

7. Fees: Any check that does not clear the bank will be returned with the entry. If you wish to re-enter, a certified check or money order in the amount of the total entry plus \$25 will be required. Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance, will be billed for these charges and a \$35 billing fee will be added to the total due.

8. Riding Times: Unofficial Times will be mailed to all exhibitors prior to the show, OFFICIAL TIMES WILL BE POSTED EVERY MORNING ONE HOUR BEFORE THE FIRST SCHEDULED RIDE. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH COMPETITOR TO CHECK THE OFFICIAL TIMES DAILY. Adequate time intervals cannot be guaranteed when riders enter more than one horse in any class. There may be considerable time between rides, if you enter classes in different levels. A letter will be sent in addition to the ride times that will contain information on awards schedule, stabling, parties and other pertinent information not included in this prize list. Riders are responsible for passing this information to their parents, trainers and owners of the horse.

9. TESTS: The Current Tests will be used.

10. Musical Freestyles: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have the CD at the announcer's stand the day before the freestyles and a representative at the stand to tell the announcer when to start and stop the tape. A scheduled sound check will be announced at the show. A back-up tape or CD is required.

11. Competition Arenas: Five or more standard 20mx60m arenas of composition footing will be used. Horses are not permitted in or around competition arenas on show days at other than scheduled ride times. *Violation of the above will be cause for elimination from the show.*

12. Warm-up Arenas: Only horses entered in the show and actually warming up for a class will be allowed in the warm-up areas. No one on foot will be allowed in the warm-up areas at any time. Lunging is to be done only in specified areas.

13. Horse Numbers must be worn at **all** times when horses are out of their stalls, mounted or unmounted, while the show is in progress.

14. Stabling: Permanent and Portable stalls are of wood or canvas construction, 10'x 10'. Only horses entered in the show will be assigned stalls. Horses may arrive any time after 2:00 P.M. on Tuesday and must leave by 12:00 noon on Monday. If you need to arrive earlier or stay longer you must make special arrangements with the management and additional fees will be required. The cost per **stall is \$175** whether used for horse or tack - for one day or the entire show. Some stalls are on concrete pads.

15. Feed and Bedding. *No straw is allowed for bedding.* Feed and bedding may be pre-ordered on the enclosed order form and faxed to 916.354.2638 (orders must be faxed in by September 28 in order for orders to be waiting at stalls) MEC bedding must be used - you are not allowed to have outside bedding delivered.

16. Grounds Fees of \$20 per horse per day will be charged for horses entered in the show but not stabled on the grounds. You are only allowed to haul in if ALL of your classes are on one day. According to USEF rules for Championship shows, if you are entered in more than 1 championship class and they are not scheduled on the same days, you **MUST** stable on the showgrounds.

17. Overnight Parking: A limited number of spaces will be available, please reserve them on your entry form. Overnight campers will be charged the same whether hooked up or not. You may only stay overnight in the RV lot.

18. Food will be available on the show grounds.

19. Hose/Washing: Do not wash horses in the barn area. Please use the wash racks. We recommend that you have a garden hose available.

20. Stall Cleaning: Please deposit all manure at the far end of the barn aisles.

21. Dogs: Dogs or pets must be on a leash AT ALL TIMES. If your pet is a nuisance to others or cannot be controlled - you may be asked to leave the show grounds.

22. Protests: See Rule VI, Articles 601-603 US Equestrian Rule Book. Protests must be in writing, signed by the protester, accompanied by a deposit of \$200 made payable to the competition, and received by the TD, member of the Show Committee, Competition Manager or Secretary within 48 hours of the alleged violation.

23. Conditions of Entry: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its Directors, and Employees, CDS harmless for any loss or accident to his or her horse, horses or equipment which may occur.

24. Awards/Prize Money: Prize money for Great American/USDF Regional Championships will be paid directly by the USDF office to the recorded horse owner within 30 days of the last day of each competition. Prize money will be divided equally for each class with 60% (\$296) of amount per class to the Champion and 40% (\$197) to the Reserve Champion. Ribbons to 8th place, Jacket and walking sheet to Champions. In the case of inclement weather, unmounted ceremonies may be held. Ribbons will be given through 5th place for warm-up classes, and awards to 1st place. Ribbons through 10th place and awards through 3rd place for CDS Championship classes with prize money paid through 5th place (30% - 25% - 20% - 25% - 10%). Prize money checks will be sent within 14 days of conclusion of horse show.

25. Awards Ceremonies: Riders placing in Great American/USDF Regional Dressage Championship classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for awards ceremonies. Failure, without prior permission of the competition manager, in consultation with the TD, The Awards Coordinator and the USDF Representative, to be present and properly attired will eliminate the official score and placing and the next highest score will move up in placing. Riders placing 1-3 in all CDS Championship classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for awards ceremonies or forfeit all prize money and awards. The tentative schedule for the awards ceremonies will be printed in the Show Program and the confirmed schedule will be posted in the show secretary's office by noon on the day prior to the start of the competition.

26. Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

27. Medical Waste: In accordance with the rules of USEF Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

28. HELMETS:Effective March 1, 2011, for dressage: Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders age 18 and over while on horses that are competing only in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test). DR 120 and GR 801.

29. Admission to Championships: Each exhibitor will be given 3 armbands with their entry, this will allow entry to the main arena. Additional armbands may be purchased from the show office when you check in. Spectator entrance will be charged Friday and Saturday evening.

30. Rider Representative: If you have any questions, comments or concerns, please see the Rider Representative at the table across from the horse show office.

NOTE: USEF Championship rules apply from the time of arrival on the grounds.

2011 USEF/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

A. Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

- Rider:**
- Must be a USDF Participating* Member (PM) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
 - Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Horse:**
- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse registration must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. If a current lease recording is on file with USDF, the lessee is recognized as "owner" for all USDF membership requirements.
 - Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
 - A horse is not required to have registry papers.
- Owner:**
- Must be a USDF member (PM* or Business Member (BM)) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
 - Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- *PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

B. Qualifying Class and Championship Eligibility

1. Horse/rider combinations which have won a USEF/USDF Regional Championship may no longer compete in a USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition, in that division, at that or a lower level (Grand Prix Level excepted) if they received the minimum qualifying score or higher for that division and level in the championship test per USEF DR127.5.
2. A horse may not be entered in more than one USEF/USDF Regional Championship at a particular level in the same calendar year.
3. Riders are NOT required to be a resident of the region to compete in that region's championship. USDF will presume qualified horses will compete in the region in which the rider resides. Riders who wish to declare a region other than their region of residence must contact the USDF office by July 1 of the championship year.
4. A rider may not compete in more than one Regional Championship competition in the same calendar year.
5. In the event a competitor is unable to produce copies of the USDF membership or lifetime horse registration documents required to enter a qualifying class, a USDF membership/registration affidavit may be completed and filed with the competition secretary. A fee of \$5 is required for each affidavit filed. The \$5 fee and a copy of the affidavit must be submitted to USDF by the competition secretary with the competition results. Copies of the required memberships and registrations MUST be included with championship entry. Affidavits will not be accepted for USEF or USDF membership or horse recording verification purposes for entry in championship classes.
6. USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals: In 2011, all junior riders through age 18 who have qualified at any level for the Regional Championships (excluding freestyle) are automatically eligible to compete in the Semi-Final classes of the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Program. One Semi-Final class will be offered for juniors, ages 13 and under, and a second Semi-Final class for riders 14 through 18 in each Great American/USDF Regional Championship. A regional champion and reserve champion for each age group will be named in each USDF region. Protective headgear as described in the USEF Rule Book GR318 will be required for participation in these classes.
7. Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF Rule Book GR812.4, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

E. Championship Rules

1. Riders must declare on the championship entry form for each level if the horse/rider combination is competing in the open, adult amateur, or junior/young rider division and must meet minimum percentage requirements for the championship division entered.
2. Any horse entered in a USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition, even if entered at two levels, must be ridden by the same rider throughout the competition. Therefore, a horse can only be ridden by one rider.
3. Cross-entering open/adult amateur divisions is NOT permitted at the same or at adjacent levels except at a level that does not offer an adult amateur division.
4. If a rider intends to enter a Regional Championship as an adult amateur, the rider must be an adult by the current USEF definition and a current amateur by the USEF definition. (USEF GR105, GR808 and DR119.3)
5. If a rider intends to enter a championship as a junior/young rider, the rider must be a junior/young rider by the current USEF definition and must submit his birth date to USDF by July 1 of the championship year.
6. Photocopies of USDF/USEF membership cards and horse recording and registration certificates must accompany championship entry (USDF PM for rider, USDF PM or BM for owner, etc.).
7. Whips may not be carried in championship tests (Exception: Competitors riding sidesaddle may carry a whip no longer than 43.3 inches (110 cm), including lash, in USEF/USDF Championships.) An adjustable-length whip may not be carried by a mounted rider.
8. All championship tests must be ridden from memory. (USEF DR122.1)
9. The gate must be closed for every USEF/USDF championship ride. (USEF DR126.6.a)
10. At no time during a USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition may any horse entered in that championship competition be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the championship competition on that horse (exception: grooms riding on loose rein). Further, any horse entered in a championship competition, even entered at two levels, must be ridden by the same rider throughout competition. (USEF DR127.6) (NOTE: This applies throughout the entire competition, even after a horse has completed its championship classes.)
11. In the event of a tie (equality of total points) for champion and/or reserve champion in USEF/USDF championships classes, the collective marks will determine first, second, and/or third or all three places; (i.e. when a tie for first place is broken by collective marks, tied competitors will receive first and second places, etc.). If collective marks are equal, the tie will remain unbroken (i.e. two first places will be awarded next third place, etc.). Ties (equality of total points) after second place will be broken by collective marks. Ties (equality of total points and collective marks) occurring in third through eighth places will remain unbroken. In the case of a tie (equality of total points and collective marks) for champion, prize money designated for champion and reserve champion will be combined and divided equally between the two competitors.
12. Hors de Concours entries are not permitted in USEF/USDF championship classes. (USEF DR119.5)
13. In a USEF/USDF championship class, the horse must obtain 50 percent or better to be named champion or reserve champion. (USEF DR123.4)
14. In USEF/USDF championship classes, a steward must be appointed to check the saddle, bits and spurs, on both sides of each horse immediately after it has completed its test and has left the arena. Any discrepancy to the saddle rules will result in immediate elimination. (USEF DR126.10)
15. A Registered (R) Dressage Technical Delegate (TD) is required to officiate at USEF/USDF championships. TDs for competitions offering qualifying and/or championship classes must investigate incidents of non-compliance and report violations to USEF. (See Section H.C.3 below and USEF GR1108.1, GR1123.9 and DR127.3)
16. Entries in USEF/USDF dressage championship classes are limited to competitors who have met the qualifications, membership, horse recording and registration requirements, and deadlines outlined in USEF DR127 and published by USDF. Competitors who are properly qualified, whose completed entries are received by the closing date for a particular Regional Championship, and who have complied with all championship rules may not be denied entry into the Regional Championship classes for which they have qualified. Only one class per division and/or level may be held to determine USEF/USDF regional champions. (USEF GR1510.2)
17. USEF/USDF championships classes may not be split. (USEF DR126.1)
18. Championship classes for juniors and young riders and Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals classes may only be held on weekends, including Friday. Juniors and young riders are limited to entry in only two championship classes, excluding freestyle.

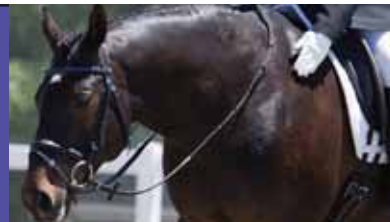

Dressage (training or schooling) is an equitation term that means the gradual harmonious development of the horse's physical and mental condition with the aim to achieve the improvement of his natural gaits and perfect understanding with his rider.

Membership types

Active membership provides all of the above privileges, as well as voting rights, and eligibility to hold office and to apply for a Qualified Riding Membership.

Family membership is an Active Membership for more than one member in an immediate family, living at the same address.

Life membership is an Active Membership for the life of the member.

A membership card is issued with each membership.

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Competitor & Member Guide* or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF BM.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or LHR number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (e-Membership): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF Web site: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

2011 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships



A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member (PM) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- A horse is not required to have registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (PM* or Business Member (BM)) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

*PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly.

USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur, and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.
