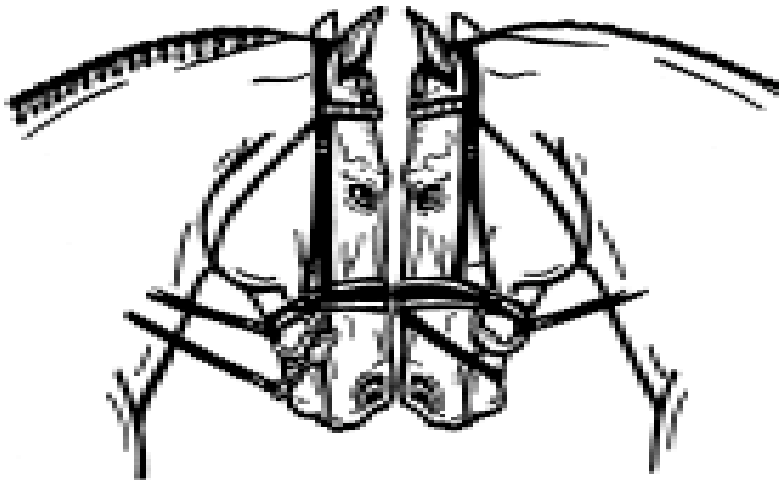

DIRECTIONS:

From the West: I-80 East to Business 80 (Sacramento area) to Hwy 50 E. Exit Hwy 50 on Bradshaw. Take Bradshaw to Jackson Rd - Hwy 16. Left onto Jackson Rd-Hwy 16. Take Jackson to Sloughhouse Road and turn right. Proceed to 7541 on the left.

From the North: I- 5 to Business 80 (Sacramento area), to Hwy 50 East. Exit Hwy 50 on Bradshaw. Take Bradshaw to Jackson Rd - Hwy 16. Left onto Jackson Rd-Hwy 16. Take Jackson to Sloughhouse Road and turn right. Proceed to 7541 on the left.

From the East: Hwy 50 from the Tahoe area, exiting to the left on Sunrise Blvd (Rancho Cordova area), then follow the directions to Highway 16. It is also possible to come from the Reno area on Interstate 80, exiting on Sierra College Blvd. (which becomes Hazel). Then go West on Highway 50, South on Sunrise Blvd, East on Jackson Highway. Take Jackson to Sloughhouse Road and turn right.

will depend on the number of entries. Sunday is planned as the primary RAAC day, but some classes will be moved to Saturday if there is not sufficient space on Sunday. If you intend to show all two or three days, and are entered in RAAC classes, please enter the RAAC as if it were to be held on Sunday and then list alternate classes for Sunday, should your RAAC class be held on Saturday. On Saturday, warm-up classes of the RAAC test will be available prior to the RAAC class. That may not necessarily be the case on Sunday. There is a complete schedule of tests available on Friday.

RAAC Awards...

- √ Training and First Levels: Embroidered cooler and neck sash to First, Neck sash to Second, ribbons Third-Tenth
- √ Second Level and above: Same, except ribbons through Sixth
- √ High Percentage Elite and Novice Rider: Neck sashes to each division
- √ Roses award: Neck sashes for High Percentage Elite and Novice Riders 50 years of age and older who officially signs up for the division prior to their RAAC test.

FROM THE CALIFORNIA DRESSAGE SOCIETY RULES

RAAC ELIGIBILITY:

- Participants at the RAAC shows must be current members of CDS, must have a USEF Amateur Card under Dressage Rules, and must be 22 year of age or older.
- The horse owner must be a current member of CDS.
- Qualification is for an amateur rider/horse team.
- **To be eligible to compete, the \$25 registration fee for each horse and rider team per level MUST BE PAID to the CDS Central Office by close of business no later than 14 days prior to the first day of competition at the regional show entered.**
- Scores earned before paying the fee will count provided the payment is received at the Central Office prior to close of business as specified above.
- **2010 Qualifying Opens: Sep 1st, 2009 at any show with CDS recognition.**
- **2010 Qualifying Closes: 14 days prior to the first competition day of the regional show entered.**
- Scores earned at the CDS Championship Show will NOT count towards qualification.
- Horse/rider teams who qualify MAY compete in ONLY ONE regional competition.
- Qualification scores must be earned at CDS recognized shows and are as follows:
 - 2 scores from 2 judges at Training Level test 3 or 4 of 60% or higher
 - 2 scores from 2 judges at 1st level of 60% or higher, any test
 - 2 scores from 2 judges at 2nd level of 60% or higher, any test
 - 2 scores from 2 judges at 3rd level of 60% or higher, any test
 - 2 scores from 2 judges at 4th level of 60% or higher, any test
 - 2 scores from 2 judges at PSG of 60% or higher
 - 2 scores from 2 judges at Intermediaire 1 of 60% or higher

Elite horse and rider teams that have won either Champion or Reserve Champion at the CDS Annual Championship Show at Training, 1st and 2nd Levels are not eligible to compete in the RAAC shows at the level they have won.

****Champion and Reserve are eligible to compete in the Series Final. If either or both have already qualified for the Series Final Class, only the third place horse will be invited. Additionally, any horse receiving a 77% or better in its age/sex class will be eligible to compete in the final.**

Materiale Classes - \$45 per class

Horses will be evaluated according to the criteria listed on the USDF Materiale Class Scoresheet and classes must be conducted according to the USDF Procedures to Host USDF Materiale Classes. (USEF Rules DR 133 and 204.4). Rider dress must confirm to USEF DR 120. Horses will be evaluated under saddle at the walk, trot and canter in both directions of the arena. In addition, four and five year old horses may be asked to lengthen the stride at the trot and canter. Horses must be at least 36 months of age to participate in Materiale Classes.

Dressage Show Class and Award Information (see RAAC page for RAAC information):

Any dressage class may be subdivided into Open (**O**), Adult/Amateur(**A/A**) and/or Junior/Young Rider(**J/YR**) when there are three or more in a sub-division. Entries with no designation are considered Open. Ribbons to fifth; awards to first (minimum of three in class). USEF Amateur card is required for all Adult Amateur awards.

High percentage awards to the Adult/Amateur, Junior/Young Rider and Open horse/rider combinations that achieve the single highest percentage test, Training through FEI. Freestyles, Pas de Deux, Quadrilles do not count.

**If you do not submit proof of Adult Amateur status, you will be entered in the Open division.
If you request a switch to Adult Amateur classes after closing, all application, post entry,
and/or change fees will be applied if the classes have already been split.**

Schedule - Dressage classes may not be run in numerical order and judges will be assigned to different tests each day when possible. Expect the higher level tests to be scheduled for the cooler parts of the day.

Guidelines for Breed Show Competitors - Compliments of USDF

- ◆ Bridle numbers must be worn at all times when out of the barn. This includes non-competing horses.
- ◆ Mares and stallions must stay on designated sides of the warm up area. Colts of the current year accompanied by their dams must stay on the mare's side of the warm up area.
- ◆ One horse, one handler – ALWAYS – including mares with foals
- ◆ All horses age two and older must wear a bridle with an approved snaffle type bit. This applies to non-competing horses as well.
- ◆ Handlers and Assistant Handlers are identified with wristbands. Only those properly identified persons will be allowed to accompany a horse into the competition area.
- ◆ Handlers and Assistant Handlers may carry one whip each. Assistant Handlers may carry a standard lunge or shorter whip. Whips may not have attachments of any type.
- ◆ Unauthorized assistance is forbidden under penalty of elimination. Any intervention by a third party with the object of facilitating the task of the competitor including voice, signals, etc., is considered illegal assistance.
- ◆ Loud snapping whips or other disruptive noise making devices are not permitted in the warm up or competition areas.
- ◆ Protective headgear while mounted is strongly encouraged
- ◆ Boots or bandages of any kind are not permitted
- ◆ Start times are a "guesstimate" and for reference only. Listen for announcements of actual times. Breed classes may be up to 60 minutes ahead or behind posted times.
- ◆ Check in with the Steward in charge of your competition arena.
- ◆ Remember that horses, especially young horses, react differently in new surroundings. Please stay alert for unpredictable behavior.

Some local rules may vary. Please refer to the USEF Rule Book DR 201-211 for complete Dressage Sport Horse rules.

LOCAL PROTOCOLS OF THE SPORT HORSE DIVISION: Sport Horses will be stabled together. Do not request to be stabled with the Sport Horses unless you have a Sport Horse entry or are willing to stable with in-hand horses. It is strongly recommended that all sport horses be stabled. In-hand horses will not be allowed in the dressage barns, arenas or warm-up arenas, upon penalty of elimination (exception: under saddle - but not with foal at side). In-hand stock is absolutely not to be paraded around or to pass by the dressage areas. Any violation of this policy will result in the offending parties being removed from the show and the showgrounds with no monies refunded.

Horses entering the Sport Horse division are PROHIBITED from using any of the dressage arenas or warm-ups unless cross-entered in the dressage classes. Those in violation will be ELIMINATED, with no monies refunded.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, USEF, CDS) for horse, owner, rider, trainer and coach (if applicable) before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Competitors are strongly urged to submit copies of their memberships and horse registrations with the entry.

Entries that are complete in every respect will be placed in the Express Line.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. *Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Quadrille will follow the rules of USDF.*
2. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
3. Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, without claim to damages.
4. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and such determinations shall be final.
5. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that every horse entered, or which they bring to the show grounds, will be subject to the rules of the Horse Show management. However, Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any horse entered or on the grounds, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the USEF, the United States Dressage Federation, the California Dressage Society, Golden State Dressage, Inc., any additional recognizing organizations, the facility (Starr Vaughn Equestrian, Inc.), the FEI, the horse show and its management and employees and volunteers for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur.
6. All Owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees or animals to stall buildings and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed are due and payable during the show. The management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed bills from premium, stake or prize money, or refunds due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting obligations to the official veterinarian, farrier or feed supplier will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.
7. Competitors are responsible for all **INSURANCE** for themselves, employees, owners, horses, etc. Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. They are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.
8. Current USEF, FEI, USDF and ParaEquestrian tests will be used.
9. USEF General Rules, Chapter 6 define the protest procedure.

ENTRIES - SCHEDULING - RIDING TIMES

10. Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis and must include all fees, membership proofs, signatures and payment. *Numbers will not be released until this process is complete; entries without payment in full will be returned.* Entries that are received, complete with payment and signatures will have priority over faxed or emailed entries. Entries received by fax or email are considered to be legal contracts and are subject to all of the rules of the show, including post/late entry fees. If the show has extended the courtesy of accepting a late, faxed or emailed entry, the responsible party will be liable to pay all class, office, stable and other fees. Those who do not comply with this will be turned in to the recognizing authorities and no future entries will be accepted until the matter has been resolved.
11. Management will close the show when it is full and place excess entries on a wait list. Entries that have arrived after the show is declared full and prior to the printed entry closing date will not be subject to late fees. Any entry postmarked later than the published entry closing date is considered a post entry and all post entry and late fees will apply.
12. Post entries allowed on a space available basis only, prior to the start of the class and after all forms have been completed, signatures obtained and fees paid. Office fee of \$10/class applied to all post entries. **AFTER CLOSING DATE:** All changes to an existing entry are subject to a \$10 (non-refundable) application fee, payable at the time the change is requested. If the change is granted, the usual class and post entry fees will be charged. A blank check must accompany the request. All change requests must be in writing.
13. Copies of all membership cards are required. The membership requirements of USEF, USDF and CDS will be strictly followed and the show will collect non-member fees for any individual or horse registration that is required and cannot be proven by presentation of the current card. To enter the Adult Amateur Division, the USEF Membership card **MUST** indicate Amateur.

If you do not submit proof of Adult Amateur status, you will be entered in the Open division. If you request to switch to Adult Amateur classes after closing, all application, post entry, and/or change fees will be applied.

14. Classes will be scheduled to accommodate the judges, riders and management. Rider scheduling preferences, if noted on the entry, will be indulged when possible. The 50 minutes between rides rule will be observed. Requests for shorter breaks will be accommodated when logistically possible. Classes will not necessarily be scheduled in order of difficulty.
15. **Provisional ride times will be EMAILED.** This file will contain all the ride times for the show; please share it with anyone who has difficulty with email. It is the obligation of the entrant to contact the Show Secretary at davenport@saber.net

if times have not been received. Scheduling conflicts must be emailed to the Show Secretary 48 hours prior to the start of the show. RIDERS SHOULD BE AWARE THAT IF THE NEED ARISES, THE SHOW MANAGEMENT CAN CHANGE RIDE TIMES AS PER USEF GR 309. **Each exhibitor is responsible to check next day's revised schedule , posted every evening at the show office.**

16. An Exhibitor's Letter with updates may be included with the riding times.

SHOWGROUNDS- RV PARKING

17. DOGS must be on leash at all times. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Show Rules 6 and 7, and USEF Chapters 6 and 7 as well as issuance of warning cards. Additionally, they will be fined \$100 per occurrence and may be refused entry into future shows at Starr Vaughn Equestrian, Inc.

18. All classes are planned to be held in the large (20mx60m) arena. Appropriate tests may be held in the small arena IF there are scheduling problems. Footing is sand and/or sand/composition in all competition and warm-up arenas.

19. A bridle number must be worn at all times when the horse is out of the stall or trailer.

20. Use of the warm-up arenas is limited to those who are entered in the show and, at the discretion of Show Management, will be restricted to those warming up for class(es) in progress when there is congestion. **NO ONE ON FOOT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE DRESSAGE WARM-UP AREAS AT ANY TIME.** There will be a designated lunge area and lungeing may be restricted to pre- and post- competition hours.

21. Food will be available on the show grounds.

22. RV hook-ups are available directly from Starr Vaughn Equestrian - 916-689-5121 to reserve a space.

STABLING - GROUNDS FEE

23. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that show management is merely providing stabling for the convenience of the participant and management and sponsoring organizations shall have no responsibility whatsoever for any injury, loss, damage, etc., as a result of using said stabling. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold Show Management, their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations harmless from any loss, damage or claims as a result of said use. **Owner/Agent/Participant assumes all care, custody, and control with regard to this use.**

24. The Stabling Request **MUST** be completed on the entry. Stabling is 10x10 portable with doors and roofs. Stabling will be assigned in order of receipt of entry, with consideration for requests made on the entry. The charge is \$165 and includes one bale of shavings. This applies whether the stall is used for an animal, tack or grooming. The fee is for the period Thursday noon through Sunday; there is no single day fee for stabling. **VERY LIMITED PERMANENT STABLING @ \$200.** PRIORITY for **permanent 12X12 stalls is as follows: Postmarks, stallions.** **On the entry, pay for the portable stabling and indicate if an upgrade is requested. You will be assessed the additional fee at check-in, if assigned.** Shavings/feed are available.

25. Wash racks are available.

26. Grounds Fee of \$30 per horse per day will be charged for all horses not stabled. This fee applies to any horse brought onto the grounds, even if the horse remains on the horse trailer or is ridden or led onto the grounds. See also Rule #30.

27. No straw is allowed. Cost of repair for any damage or defacement of property will be charged to the Exhibitor.

EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE TO INSPECT STALL AND REPORT PRE-EXISTING DAMAGE PRIOR TO USING STALL.

28. Please deposit all manure at the end of the barn aisles. Waste materials must be disposed of properly, in accordance with State law and the rules of USEF.

30. \$50 fee per show for non-competing horses. Each non-competing horse must have a signed release, wear an assigned number, must observe the rules governing the use of the warm-up areas and must pay any required fees, including stabling and grounds fees. Any horse brought onto the grounds, including the parking lots, is subject to the rules of the show. This includes horses that never leave a horse trailer. Violations of this rule will result in double the fees due. Note: Priority in availability and location of stabling will be given to horses entered in classes

31. Checks payable to: Golden State Dressage, Inc.

32. Any balance due at the end of the show will be billed with a billing charge of \$30. Payment must be made immediately upon receipt of the bill. Non-payment will result in the individual being turned in to the sponsoring organizations, in addition to legal ramifications.

33. **REFUND REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED.** Refunds for cancellations made prior to stated entry closing date will be made in full, less a \$75 processing fee. After entry closing date, refunds will be made ONLY for classes that are filled from the wait list AND if the following conditions are met: 1) a veterinarian's certificate or rider's medical excuse must be submitted, 2) notification must be in writing to the Show Office PRIOR to the show day(s) in question. A processing fee of \$20 per class will be deducted from the refund. Refund lists are maintained in order of date and time of scratch. Refunds will be applied to the list, starting with the earliest valid scratch. **There will be no refund for stabling once it is ordered. There will be no refunds of any sort (including but not limited to haul-in, drug, class, office and association fees) for same day scratches or no shows. The fees will be considered a contribution to the show.**

34. Checks returned by the bank will be assessed \$25 upon the first return and will not be run through a second time. A cashier's check or cash will be needed to clear the entry.

35. In the event that all or part of the competition is cancelled due to a storm, accident or any other emergency, the competition will not be responsible for refunding entry, stabling, office or any similar fees for the cancelled class or classes .

AWARDS - PRIZE MONEY - FREESTYLES - MISCELLANEOUS

36. No prize money is anticipated for this show. CDS Foothills Chapter is responsible for the RAAC awards.

37. Show management reserves the right to amend award information by making notification in subsequent advertising and communications such as exhibitor letters and show programs.

38. Scored tests will be given only to riders or their agents and only after the results are finalized and the class is placed. Any disputes concerning scores, divisions entered, and/or placings must be brought to the attention of the Show Office within one hour of the end of the show day. Scores and placings become final at that time.

39. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have the cued tape or CD at the announcer's stand at the start of the ride and a representative at the stand to tell the announcer when to start and stop the tape. A sound check will be conducted at each show; make arrangements directly with the announcer. Exhibitors are responsible for retrieving their own tapes/CDs.

40. Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF Recognized Competition prior to the competition being entered. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.

STATE BORDER CROSSINGS:

41. The most recent information available on documents necessary for transporting horses across state lines is available at the following numbers: Nevada Department of Agriculture - (775) 688-1180 and California Department of Agriculture - (916) 654-1447. Be sure to ask if there are any prohibitions against feed as well.

JUNIORS

42. All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent at all times while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent shall assume all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall indemnify, defend and hold Show Management, its employees and volunteers, the facility, Golden State Dressage, Inc and all affiliated organizations harmless therefrom.

43. USEF GR301.5: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds or recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PONY MEASUREMENT

43. The show will assist with this process but cannot guarantee the presence of a veterinarian. Anyone interested in having a pony measured by the Technical Delegate must make arrangements with the on-call veterinarian to come to the

show to participate in the measurement. The show will not be responsible for making any of these arrangements and advises that if the on-call veterinarian feels it is necessary to travel to a sick or injured horse instead of coming to the show to measure, the show will in no way be held responsible or liable for this decision on the part of the veterinarian.

SHARPS CONTAINERS

44. Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

2010 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series



The Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series (USDFBC) is a program designed to promote breeders and showcase quality sport horses. Each series will consist of at least three qualifying events in designated geographical areas of the United States, which will lead to a final event in each series. Exhibitors compete at qualifying events for the champion and reserve champion current year foal, filly, colt/gelding, mare and stallion. These horses

are then invited to compete in each of their respective classes, in the final event of that series, which is where the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion current year foal, filly, colt/gelding, mare, and stallion will be determined.

For a list of events participating in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series or the complete rules and guidelines, contact USDF at (859) 971-2277 or www.usdf.org. A list of upcoming events is also included in the *USDF Connection*.

Qualifying System

The USDFBC Series is scheduled on a calendar year basis (January 1-December 31).

A series must have a minimum of three qualifying events in order to hold a series final. All shows in the series, including qualifier classes held in conjunction with the final of the series, are qualifying events.

The final event of each series is normally the last USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competition holding DSHB classes scheduled in a particular geographical area of the United States as of July 1 of the year prior to the series final year. However, a series final may also be held at either a separate dressage or DSHB show which does not offer other DSHB classes, and is not a USDFBC qualifying event. Host sites of series finals will be designated on or about July 1 of the year prior to the series final.

If a USDFBC Series does not have at least three qualifying events registered with USDF by June 1 of the series final year, the final will not be held for that series.

Horses may compete in qualifying events in any series, but they may participate in only one final class. Horses must qualify in the series in which they enter the final. Exception: Horses that have qualified for a series final which is either not scheduled or is cancelled may participate in the final of any other USDFBC series in the same calendar year, without having to re-qualify for that series. Owners of horses that have qualified for a final which is not held, may enter another series final, but must indicate which series they qualified at on their entry form.

Series final events must allow late entries in the series final classes for horses that qualified for the series final event after the official closing date for the final event.

If there is a change of ownership of the horse, the new owner(s) may choose to participate in the series final where they reside, regardless of where they qualified, provided that the new owner contacts the USDF office and initiates the change at least 30 days prior to the new Series Final date. (BOG 12/08)

Each qualifying event must offer a current year foal class, a filly championship class, a colt/gelding championship class, a mare championship class and a stallion championship class. These classes are USDFBC qualifying classes. The champion and reserve champion in each of these classes, from each series qualifying event, are eligible to compete in their respective USDFBC series final class. A third place horse in each series qualifying championship class must be named as well. If the champion, reserve or both have already qualified for the series final class, the third place horse will also be invited to compete in the series final class. In addition, any other horse receiving a 77% or better in its age/sex class will be eligible to compete in the final class. A list of qualified horses is maintained by series on the USDF Web site.

Current Year Foal Championship

The current year foal championship class at qualifying events must be open to first and second place winners of Sport Horse Prospect In Hand classes for all horses of current calendar year, as listed below. First and second place (and third if desired) fillies and colts/geldings of current year will compete against each other in the same class. (Organizers have the option of including third placed winners in championship classes.)

Filly and Colt/Gelding Championship

The Filly and Colt/Gelding Championship classes at qualifying events must be open to first and second place winners of Sport Horse Prospect In Hand classes for all horses as listed below. (Organizers have the option of including third placed winners in championship classes.)

Mare and Stallion Championship

The Mare and Stallion Championship classes at qualifying events must be open to first and second place winners of Breeding Stock In Hand classes for horses age four years old and over, as listed below. (Organizers have the option of including third placed winners in championship classes.)

Mare Championship:
Mare classes may be divided by age, competition and/or breeding status, as in the following example:

Four-year old and older maiden mares – never bred
Four-year old and older yield mares-never bred or not currently bred or nursing
Four-year old and older broodmares – In foal or currently nursing (mare only to be judged).

2010 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships



A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), licensed by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a GMO is received by April 1 of the prior year.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.

A horse is not required to have registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (Participating or Business) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

*Participating Members are USDF members who join USDF directly

Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider. FEI Junior Rider and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only Open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Directory* or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership (BM).)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$35). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$20 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Non-Member (NM) identification number, Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary on that same day.
