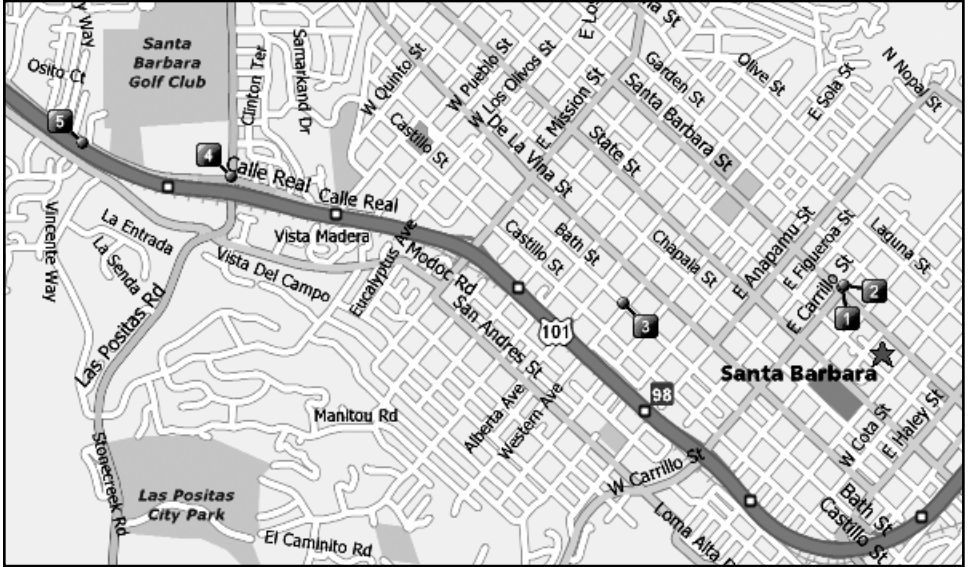

# **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

**PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!**

1. This show is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
2. **ENTRIES:** Entries close and must be postmarked by September 5, 2010. Correct fees and association numbers must accompany each entry form. Entries accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. No numbers issued without completed entries, payment, signatures, fees and association numbers. Parents/guardians must sign entries for minors.  
**LATE ENTRIES:** All entries must be postmarked on or before the closing date or will be subject to a late fee of \$25.  
**SCRATCHES:** Fees for scratches made prior to the closing date will be refunded less the \$25 office fee. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to inform the show office of his or her intention to scratch. There will be no refunds after the closing date. No-Shows will be billed for all unpaid entry fees. Show credit given after closing date **ONLY** with vet certificate and **ONLY** for class fees.  
**POST ENTRIES:** Post entries will be accepted to fill scratches if the schedule permits. Horses already entered in the show will receive priority.  
**CHANGES:** Entry changes made after closing date, at competitor request, will be subject to an Administrative fee of \$25.  
**RETURNED CHECKS:** All checks returned by the bank will be charged an additional 10% penalty (\$25 minimum). Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or equivalent or they will be turned over to USEF for further disciplinary action.
3. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. EC 7/21/08 Effective 12/1/08
4. **FEES:** USEF Federation fee is \$8, USEF Drug Fee is \$7, Junior and Senior Non-members pay \$30, USDF Non-members pay \$20 with card (no card \$25). CDS Travel Grant is \$2, CDS Non-members pay \$10. CDFA Drug Fee is \$5. DASC non-member fee is \$5. DASC Championship Show Fee is \$1. **NOTE:** CDS members who participate in a CDS recognized show may not be required to pay non-member fees to any other organization (National Federation - USEF or National Breed Organizations exempted) in order to participate in the show. CDS non-member rule: For CDS recognized shows in California, Nevada, Arizona and Oregon, CDS agrees to a reciprocal non-member system where CDS will waive the nonmember fee IF the competitor and/or owner is a member of another USDF GMO; and in return the show management will not charge CDS members a non-member fee for any other GMO. If the competitor and/or owner is not a member of CDS or any other GMO, then the show management will charge and collect non-member fees for CDS.
5. **MINOR EXHIBITORS:** Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold Santa Barbara CDS and Earl Warren Showground, harmless for injury to such minor. No minor's entry will be accepted unless it is signed by a parent or guardian. The signatures of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable.
6. **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:** Every horse and pony entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its Directors, and Employees, Santa Barbara CDS, its Directors and Employees, harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes, or to change officials as it deems necessary. The decision of Show Management is final.
7. **MANAGEMENT:** The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and to cancel award prizes without claim to damage, to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute officials. The judges' decisions are strictly their own and the Management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions.
8. **OPPORTUNITY CLASSES:** "Opportunity" classes are for entry level riders. Horses and riders competing in "Opportunity" classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership requirements, and do not have to pay non-member or HID fees. Horses entered only in "Opportunity" classes are exempt from the Federation fees, including the Drugs & Medication fee. However, horses entered in these classes are still subject to and must comply with all Drugs & Medication rules and are subject to testing

- at this competition. Horse/riders will be allowed to cross-enter into other recognized classes at this show. However, please note, if a horse or rider enters other non-opportunity classes at this competition in which membership by participants is required, all USEF, USDF, DASC and CDS membership requirements apply for horse, rider, owner, trainer, etc. Scores earned in Dressage "Opportunity" classes may not be used towards USEF, USDF, CDS or DASC awards or programs.
9. CLOSED ARENAS: Horses are not permitted in competition arenas on a show day at any time other than scheduled riding times. VIOLATION will be cause for ELIMINATION.
10. LONGEING: Absolutely no longeing in the warm-up arena. Longeing ONLY in the designated areas. Check with Show Office for location.
11. RIDING TIMES: Ride times will be posted at [www.dressagetimes.com](http://www.dressagetimes.com) or call 818-269-2911. It is the rider's responsibility to inform the management of any time conflicts at least 72 hours prior to the scheduled rides. Failure to enter the ring by the specified time will result in elimination from the class.
12. TESTS: Current USEF and FEI Tests will be ridden.
13. 2010 GAIG/USDF QUALIFYING REQUIREMENTS: In order to qualify for a Regional Championship, horse/rider combinations may qualify by earning a minimum of 2 qualifying scores at two official GAIG/USDF recognized competitions from two different judges in any region. Both horse/rider must be registered with USDF. Riders may now ride in qualifying classes on both days.
14. SCORED TESTS: Tests will be given ONLY TO RIDERS or their agents and only after the class is placed. Check all scores upon receipt of test.
15. PRIZES AND AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded to fifth place. Class awards will be divided into Open, Amateur and Junior/Young Rider. High-Point ribbons will be awarded for A/A, O, Jr/YR, Freestyle, Pas de Deux, Pony. First place and high-point prizes will be awarded for classes and high-point categories with two or more rides.
16. CANCELLATION: In the event of rain prior to the show, it is the responsibility of the rider to call the Management to determine whether the show is canceled. Shows are NOT canceled unless the footing is deemed unsafe. If the show is canceled for any reason, a \$25 office fee will be retained from each entry and the balance refunded.
17. STABLING AND FOOTING AT EARL WARREN SHOWGROUNDS: Day stalls \$50; weekend stalls \$100, no bedding or feed is provided, permanent wood 10x10 wood box stalls with dutch doors. Please call LA CUMBRE FEED for shavings/hay delivery before Wednesday @ 4 pm: 805.687.1880. There is a grounds fee of \$35 per horse per day for horses not stabled. There will be one, two or three competition arenas, one or two warm-up arenas, and a designated longeing area—all with sand footings.
18. STALL CLEANING: Please deposit all manure to the end of each barn aisle on the mountain end for pick up by Earl Warren Showground personnel.
19. PARKING: Parking of cars, truck and trailers is allowed in designated areas only. Check with the show office before parking. Please do not park in the aisles.
20. HOSE/WASHING: Do not wash horses in barn areas. Please use the wash racks. We recommend that you have a garden hose available.
21. SCHOOLING HORSES: Horses not entered in the show must be registered with the Horse Show Office and will be given a number to be worn at all times outside of the stall. Appropriate stall or ground fees, drug fees, mandatory administrative fee and a \$35 schooling fee PER show day must be paid. Any person riding a schooling horse must have signed an official entry agreement form and/or release form. Schooling horses scratching after scratch date will be charged a \$15 Office fee.
22. JUDGES: It is the purpose of the management to run the Horse Show at the highest possible level of sportsmanship. The Management used the utmost care to select judges with broad experience and knowledge. The judges' decisions in the show ring are their own responsibility and Management accepts no responsibility for those decisions.
23. PROTESTS: Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$100 with the secretary of the show, which sum will be forfeited to the Horse Show if not sustained. All protests must be filed in writing, signed by the protester, and filed with the Show secretary within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation.
24. DOGS: Dogs must be on a leash at all times.
25. OVERNIGHT PARKING: All RV's are subject to overnight fees, contact Earl Warren Office at 805.687.0766 for details.
26. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles if they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS: Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, USEF) for horse, owner, rider and trainers, before the day(s) of competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

## 2010 Central Regional Adult Amateur Competition

### ELIGIBILITY:

- Participants at the RAAC shows must be current members of CDS, must have a USEF Amateur Card under Dressage Rules, and must be 22 year of age or older.
- The horse owner must be a current member of CDS.
- Qualification is for an amateur rider/horse team.
- To be eligible to compete, the \$25 registration fee for each horse and rider team per level **MUST BE PAID** to the CDS Central Office by close of business no later than September 5, 2010.
- Scores earned before paying the fee will count provided the payment is received at the Central Office prior to close of business as specified above.
- 2010 Qualifying Opens: Sep 1st, 2009 at any show with CDS recognition.
- 2010 Qualifying Closes: September 5, 2010
- Scores earned at the CDS Championship Show will **NOT** count towards qualification.
- Horse/rider teams who qualify **MAY** compete in **ONLY ONE** regional competition.
- Qualification scores must be earned at CDS recognized shows and are as follows:
  - 2 scores from 2 judges at Training Level test 3 or 4 of 60% or higher
  - 2 scores from 2 judges at 1st level of 60% or higher, any test
  - 2 scores from 2 judges at 2nd level of 60% or higher, any test
  - 2 scores from 2 judges at 3rd level of 60% or higher, any test
  - 2 scores from 2 judges at 4th level of 60% or higher, any test
  - 2 scores from 2 judges at PSG of 60% or higher
  - 2 scores from 2 judges at Intermediare 1 of 60% or higherElite horse and rider teams that have won either Champion or Reserve Champion at the CDS Annual Championship Show at Training, 1st and 2nd Levels are not eligible to compete in the RAAC shows at the level they have won.

### REQUIRED CLASSES AND SPECIFICATIONS:

Elite Adult Amateur Division for riders that have competed in a CDS Championship Show.

Novice Adult Amateur Division for riders that have never competed in a CDS Championship Show Horse of the Year class.

This competition will feature USEF National Level Tests from Training through 4th level classes and FEI classes at Prix St. George and Intermediare 1. A total of 14 regular dressage classes will be conducted.

Competitors will be required to ride once at the highest test of the level entered.

Competitors will ride for 1 judge and will be permitted to carry a whip and/or have the test read.

Riders age 50 and over that wish to qualify for the "Roses Award" for Hi –Point Elite and Novice Rider, please be sure to sign-up in the horse show office. This information is required prior to the RAAC class.

### PRIZE LIST INFORMATION ON RAAC AWARDS:

Training and 1st Levels will receive: an embroidered cooler for 1st place and a neck ribbon; 2nd place winner a neck ribbon and a halter; and 3rd – 10th place bridle ribbons.

2nd Level and above will receive: an embroidered cooler to 1st place with neck ribbon; 2nd place winner a neck ribbon and a halter; 3rd – 6th place bridle ribbons.

High Percentage Score Elite and Novice Rider – 36" bridle ribbon to each division.

Roses Award neck ribbon for High Percentage Elite and Novice Rider 50 years of age and older that officially sign-up for the division prior to their RAAC ride.

## RAAC AWARDS CEREMONIES AND HONOR ROUNDS:

Will be scheduled during the lunch break for classes concluded in the morning session, and at the conclusion of the last class of the day for afternoon classes.

All RAAC award winners (up through 10th place) will be invited to participate in the awards presentations. Those competitors that participate in the awards presentation will be properly attired in show clothes and show tack. Protective boots or wraps on the horses are permitted.

1st/2nd place finishers as well as High Score and Roses Award winners are required to have photographs with all appropriate awards won taken in front of the RAAC Banner. The RAAC Rider Rep (or the designated alternate) can excuse a winner if some unusual situation or emergency occurs, provided the competitor has requested permission to be excused from awards presentations in advance.

All pony riders must inform show management that they would like to be eligible for the pony award and to be designated on the results cover sheet if they are the high score pony. To be eligible, all ponies must have a current USEF Pony Measurement Card. CDS will also offer a Year End Award for the overall highest scoring pony Training Level and above. You must present your Pony Measurement card to the show secretary. Any pony can enter any Training Level class and above. Please note on your entry form **"Pony"**.

**USDF Membership Benefits:** USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Directory* or the USDF Web site at [www.usdf.org](http://www.usdf.org).

**Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:** Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership (BM).)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

## Memberships Defined

**Participating Membership (PM):** A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$35). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

**Group Membership (GM):** A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

**Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

**Non-Member (NM) Identification Number:** For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$20 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

**Horse Identification (HID) Number:** A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

**Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR):** A horse with an LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Non-Member (NM) identification number, Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

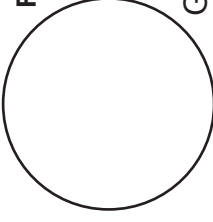
