CDS JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER TEAM COMPETITION CLASS LIST

~ No qualifying scores are required for entry ~
Special Award to each member of winning team in a division
Ribbons through 6th place
Entry Fees: \$100 per rider

You may enter as an Individual or as a Team. Individual riders will be matched with other individual riders or partial teams entering the same division. If you cannot be matched up with a team, your entry fees will be refunded.

Teams may be made up by 3 to 5 members. If you have fewer than the required number of riders, enter as a team and we will try to match you with an individual rider completing the team. Give your team name and the names of known team members. Teams must have names at time of entry or a name will be assigned by management.

Each competitor will ride two tests at his level, plus a Dressage Equitation test and an Oral Theory test. All required tests will be averaged - 66.67% (dressage tests) 33.33% (equitation/theory combined.)

All scores from each team member will be counted. No scores will be dropped. Total points from each team member will be added together and divided by the number of team members to compute team placing. Three, Four or Five member teams may be in the same division. Elimination from one test does not eliminate that rider from the Team Competition. Elimination will be scored as a zero for that test.

Whips and readers are permitted for these classes. See Rules and Regulations for JR/Yr Championship Show for all other information.

Equitation Class Protocol

Team members must enter Equitation Class – see page 5

Times will be posted.

Riders on two teams ride only once.

A borrowed horse may be used.

A rider entered as an Individual will be scheduled with Team riders.

Riders are required to:

1. Check in with the paddock steward prior to the assigned times.
2. Stay in the area so that further instructions from the paddock steward can be heard.
3. Any person interfering with the paddock stewards or TD during Equitation warm ups may incur elimination of the rider involved.

Qualifying Requirements for Junior / Young Rider Championship Classes

To qualify, the owner and rider must be a current member of CDS and must achieve all of the Two required scores at a CDS recognized show during the current show season. Classes must have been judged by an USEF licensed judge at a show recognized by CDS. Two or more judges on a single ride will count as one when averaged together. All classes open to juniors and young riders.

Training Level

Two scores of 62% or better from two judges

First Level

Two scores of 60% or better from two judges

Second Level

Two scores of 57% or better from two judges

Third Level

Two scores of 57% or better from two judges

FEI Junior Level

Two scores of 57% or better from two judges

Fourth Level

Two scores of 57% or better from two judges

FEI YR Level (Young Rider Team Test or PSG)

Two scores of 57% or better from two judges

FEI Level (FEI Test of Choice)

Two scores of 57% or better from two judges

1. For JR/YR Championship Classes, please note that previous Champion and Reserve Champion horse-rider combinations at Training and First levels are not eligible to compete at the same level in a subsequent Championship show.
2. All participants who enter the JR/YR Championship South and who will compete at Training Level through Fourth Level will ride the TWO tests of the highest difficulty level of the level. Tests must be ridden from memory and whips may not be carried during the test. In the Championship Classes placing will be determined by averaging the percents earned in BOTH tests.
3. Participants entering Class 305 will ride the FEI Junior Team, FEI Junior Individual and FEI JR/YR Freestyle tests. Tests must be ridden from memory and whips may not be carried during the test. Placing will be determined by averaging the percents earned in all THREE tests.
4. Participants entering Class 501 will be required to ride the FEI Young Rider Team (Prix St. George), FEI Young Rider Individual and FEI Young Rider Freestyle tests. Tests must be ridden from memory and whips may not be carried during the test. Placing will be determined by averaging the percents earned in all THREE tests.
5. Participants entering Class 505 will be required to ride two FEI tests. The same test may be ridden both days. Tests must be ridden from memory and whips may not be carried during the test. Placing will be determined by averaging the percents earned in BOTH tests.

Qualifying Scores must be completed by September 11, 2011 and received via fax to the Show Secretary no later than 4:00 PM on Monday, September 12. Scores received after this date/time will not be counted toward Championship qualification. There are no exceptions to this policy. Entry fees will be refunded, less a \$30 processing fee, to those failing to qualify. All Championship classes must be ridden from memory. Whips may not be carried in Championship classes.

Entry fee includes two FEI tests of choice (same test may be ridden twice)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. Each competitor is responsible for supplying the show secretary with copies of their current CDS numbers for OWNERS and RIDERS by the closing date. Failure to supply said numbers may result in elimination from Championship classes. Non-member fee may be paid for Summer Celebration and Team Competition.
2. All entries must be RECEIVED and paid by August 26, 2011. Failure for any reason to have entries RECEIVED by this date will incur a late fee and may result in the inability to compete in Championship Classes.
3. The last date to obtain a qualify score for the Championship portion of the Show is September 11, 2011. Fax or Email notification must be made to the Show Secretary by 4:00 PM Monday, September 12, 2011.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS - GENERAL INFORMATION

USEF RULING: Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therein. Scores received at both the North and South Championship Show will count toward the 2012 CDS Annual Show.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final.

AGE DEFINITION: *USEF DR 119.3*; Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they will be 18 years of age. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 years and until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21 years of age. Competitors will compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22.

ENTRY DATE: Complete entries must be RECEIVED by August 26, 2011. Late entries will be placed on a wait list and incur a \$100.00 late fee.

QUALIFICATION DATE: The final day to qualify for the Championship Show is September 11, 2011. All qualifying scores occurring on or before this date, but after closing date, must be faxed to the Show Secretary and be received by 4:00PM, September 12, 2011. Participants expecting to complete the qualification after the closing date MUST pre-enter the Championship Show/Classes. If qualification is not achieved by September 11, the participant must withdraw from the Championship portion of the Show. All entry fees for the championship class shall be returned minus a \$30.00 processing fee. Participants without qualifying scores are not excluded from the Team Competition or the Warm-up / Open classes. Failure to notify secretary will result in being disqualified with no refund.

QUALIFYING SCORES: Please note that ONLY scores from recognized CDS shows and three star CDS / USEF / USDF shows may count toward qualifying for the JR/YR Championship Show.

REFUNDS: Refunds minus a \$30.00 processing fee will be given in full prior to the entry closing date of August 26, 2011. Withdrawals after August 26, 2011 will not be refunded. Should a medical necessity require withdrawal of the horse or rider after August 26, 2011 an appeal for refund may be made to the Executive Show Committee. Any decision of the Executive Show Committee is final. Please note that any such request must be accompanied by a statement of explanation from a certified veterinarian, physician or nurse practitioner. Refunds are not issued for Show Cancellation unless such cancellation occurs secondary to unsafe footing conditions.

ENTRY SIGNATURES: Entry forms MUST be completed in their entirety including all signatures as required. A parent's signature is required for all entries of minor children under age 18years. Parents may sign as "trainer" and non-member fees will be waived. The Code of Conduct must be signed. Failure to sign the Code of Conduct is cause for elimination.

MEMBERSHIP: Copies of CDS membership cards for *rider and owner* must accompany the entry form.

ENTRIES: Entry forms MUST be accompanied by payment in full. As such, faxed entry forms shall not be accepted. Postdated checks (those dated after the entry form completion date) are not acceptable for payment. Any check returned for insufficient funds will incur a penalty equal to not less than \$30.00 or 10% of the total entry fees whichever is greater. A certified or cashier's check must then be issued to clear the entry. Payment in full must be RECEIVED by August 26, 2011. Any payment RECEIVED past the entry closure date may incur late fees.

CHANGES: Changes requested after the entry closing date will be assessed an Office Fee of \$25 per change. This fee will not apply if the change is at the instigation of Show Management. Requests to add classes may be made on a space available basis. Classes may be scratched at any point prior to the participant's start time in the given class; however, refunds will not be issued.

PONY DECLARATION FOR THE PARKER PONY TROPHY: Any animal not over 148 centimeters without shoes or 149 centimeters with shoes are classified as ponies. A copy of the USEF Federation Standard or Temporary Measurement Certificate must be submitted with the entry. If your pony does not have a measurement certificate and you want to compete for the Parker Pony Trophy, you must notify the secretary, in advance for an appointment to measure the pony. Measurements will be conducted Friday afternoon of the competition in accordance with USEF Rule DR132.

RIDE TIMES: Participants will be emailed the schedule at least one week before the competition and may check their ride times at www.california-dressage.org. Times will be mailed upon request. DO NOT call the Show Secretary or Show Manager for individual riding times.

DOGS: All dogs must be on leash and restrained at all times while on the show grounds. DOGS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED AT THE WARM-UP ARENAS – WHETHER ON LEASH OR OFF. DOGS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN ANY AREAS WITH FOOD SERVICE. Unrestrained dogs create a serious safety hazard to exhibitors and their horses. Therefore, NON-COMPLIANCE WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a fine of \$100. A second offense may cause the owner to be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises. No dogs allowed in seating area.

STABLING: All stalls are 12 x 12 permanent with Dutch doors and are available for \$160. No first bedding included. NO STRAW BEDDING WILL BE PERMITTED – ONLY SHAVINGS. It is strictly forbidden to remove stall doors, hammer nails, or attach anything directly onto concrete blocks. Exhibitors will be fined \$100 per violation, and will be billed for any damage to property. Water buckets and hoses must be provided by exhibitors. Horses not requiring a stall will be charged a \$50 per day grounds fee.

FEED AND BEDDING: Feed orders must be made by 1:00 pm each day for same day delivery. For advanced orders, call the FAIRGROUNDS FEED STORE OFFICE AT (858) 509-5245.

STALL CLEANING: Please deposit all manure at the end of the barn and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls.

MEDICAL WASTE: Please deposit all needles and syringes in appropriate containers or give to the show's veterinarian.

HOSE WASHING: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water usage. Violators will be fined \$50 for each violation.

HORSES OR EQUIPMENT placed in the wrong stall will be moved to the assigned stall and the exhibitor, owner or parent will be charged for any clean-up required. To avoid penalty charges, changes must be made through the show management or stabling agent.

PARKING: Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Vehicles improperly parked, including NO PARKING ZONES AND FIRE LANES, will be issued citations and/or towed from premises at the vehicle owner's expense. There are Handicap Parking areas in the stable area and public parking lot.

RV PARKING: (Reservations for RV parking must be made through the Feed Store ONLY.) All RV's must be self contained. Campers will be charged the same rate whether hooked-up or not. RV parking is allowed only in the designated area.

WARM-UP / LUNGING: Horses MUST wear their show numbers at all times that they are outside their designated stalls. This includes all hand-walking, bathing, lunging and warm-ups. No persons on foot shall be allowed in designated warm-ups. Lungeing is to be done ONLY in specified areas. Arena must be vacated while equipment is being used. Horses may not be turned out in arenas at any time.

RIDING RESTRICTIONS: At no time may any horse entered be ridden by anyone other than the one rider entered in the show. Any horse entered in the show, even if entered at two levels, must be ridden by the same rider throughout the competition.

CROSS ENTRY between the Del Mar International show and the JR/YR Championships is allowed. However, the USEF rules will prevail concerning the number of tests allowed for a horse which are: three tests at fourth level and below and two tests at the FEI level.

TESTS: All tests are performed in a standard 20x60meter arena. All current USEF, FEI, JR/YR Tests, FEI Freestyle and USDF Freestyle tests will be used.

MUSIC CD's: It is the participant's responsibility to ensure that his/her music is at the announcer's booth PRIOR TO their entry to the competition arena. Participants are encouraged to conduct a sound check of their music prior to the competition. Information on a sound check is available at the JR/YR Show Office. The participant must ensure that the music is appropriately cued and must signal the announcer to start the music. It is the participant's responsibility to retrieve his/her music before leaving.

SCORING: Ties will not be broken.

AWARDS PRESENTATION: will be posted – team and championship classes only.

CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW PARTICIPATION: A single horse-rider pair may compete in the North or South Championship Show, but NOT both.

FOOD: Food will be available on the Show Grounds. The Show Office can provide an additional list of local grocery stores and restaurants.

HELMETS: *Effective March 1, 2011.* for dressage: Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders *age 18 and over* while on horses that are competing *only* in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test.) For more details, please see DR 120.5.

Horses must wear their bridle numbers when out of their stalls.

UNPAID CHARGES: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance of entry fees, of feed/shavings, etc., will be charged for these charges and a \$35 billing fee will be added to the total

Only horses entered in the show and wearing official competition numbers will be allowed in the official warm-up arenas. Horses must wear their number when out of the stall.

In the event of rain prior to the show, it is the rider's responsibility to call the management to determine whether the show is canceled. Shows are NOT canceled unless the footing is deemed unsafe.

GENERAL LIABILITY INFORMATION

All owners, participants and parents will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, friends, employees to any stalls, buildings, arenas, facilities or other properties on the Show Grounds, and will be billed accordingly for any such damages. It is strictly prohibited to dismantle or alter stalls or barn structures in ANY WAY. No nails may be used on the stalls. E-Z Up or similar tent structures MUST be securely anchored into the ground. Individuals supplying such tents shall be held liable for any damages to persons, horses, or property should the tent be secured incorrectly. Competitors, trainers, agents, riders or handlers, parents or associates who cause undo furor or perceived danger to themselves, others or *any horse* as determined by the Show Management will be asked to remain separated from other competitors or, should the problem be deemed unmanageable, will be asked to exit the show grounds.

SHOW MANAGEMENT: The Show Management Staff reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes without claim to damages; (2) To change, cancel or combine any classes; (3) To reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; and (4) to change rings or rotate judges. The Show Management Staff reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management Staff. All decisions herein are final.

EVERY HORSE ENTERED for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any damage or loss that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold CDS, 22nd DAA, the Horse Show, it's Directors and Employees, harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses, or equipment, which may occur from sickness, theft or otherwise.

In accordance with USEF GR1301.7

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
